Agnies van Eeghen is an Intellectual Disability Physician. This is a novel medical specialty in The Netherlands, designed to provide somatic and neuropsychiatric care for adolescents and adults with genetic neurodevelopmental disorders and/or ID. After this training, she obtained a PhD on the neuropsychiatric phenotype of Tuberous Sclerosis Complex at Massachusetts General Hospital.

At the Amsterdam Medical Centers, she provides tertiary care for children and adults with genetic neurodevelopmental disorders and/or Intellectual Disability, including evaluation and treatment of physical and neuropsychiatric manifestations. She leads expert centers for adults with Fragile X Syndrome and Tuberous Sclerosis and is consultant for expert centers for Down Syndrome, 16p11.2 del/dup syndrome and PHIP syndrome.

Her research focuses on interventions and outcome measures for rare disorders, and on the natural history of neuropsychiatric phenotypes, in adolescence and adulthood, in various disorders including FXS; she is involved in the transitional age phase, and on the occurrence and phenomenology of neurodegenerative disorders.

Dr. van Eeghen chairs the national guideline committee for ID medicine in the Netherlands, and the ERN ITHACA Guideline Working Group.
